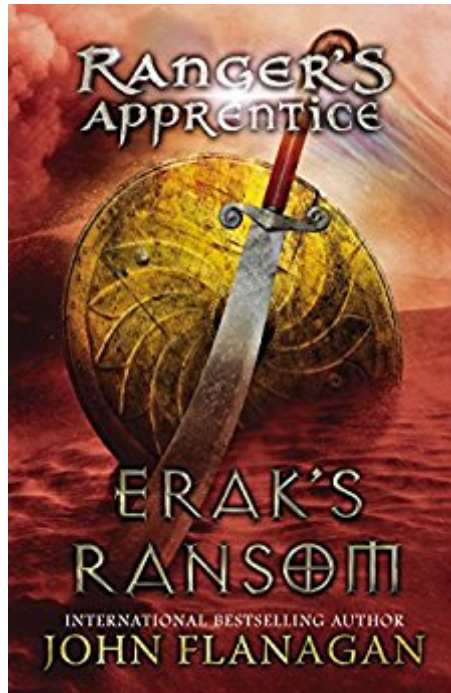




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Erak's Ransom: Book 7 (Ranger's Apprentice)

Each book does a nice job of standing alone without the boiler plate that some authors feel required to use in series (Wheel of Time) Each book builds on the last and the whole series is a fun bit of fantasy with out the sex and gore that seem to be requisite for "adult fiction", well developed characters and interesting storylines keep the series going.

I saw one review here that said that this was the weakest book in the series, and I can confess that I utterly and completely disagree with that. Starting off in Toscana, with Will and Halt on a diplomatic mission, and also studying war techniques of the Toscanan militants, it gets off to a good start and also drifts into the land of Nihon-Ja, where Horace is also up to similar things among the Emperor and his own people. I could ramble on about the plot, but I'd rather compare this book to the other

ones. Compared to the rest of the books, how is it weak? If I had to go back and count every single man who dies in this book, and then have someone say that this book is weak is a bit ridiculous. True, there are other deaths in the previous nine books, but I'd have to say that this was the biggest all-out battle, and there was quite the suspense leading up to it. The book moved along nicely, with a fast pace and very good plot. But there really wasn't any character development, except among Alyss and Evanlyn. I liked how they threw in the Skandians for yet another book, and Selethen is one of my favorite characters so I'm glad he was along for the ride as well. After what I first thought was a pointless beginning, that would have no real meaning in the end, turned out to be a very big part of the final battle, I realized that the book was better done than I had first thought. So, basically, don't get halfway through it and start getting discouraged, a lot of things happen for a purpose in this book, and the climax is definitely worth going through the previous 50 chapters.

I have enjoyed this series! This book was not disappointing. The only reason it received a 3-star rating is because of its placement in the series. I feel like this should have been book 6 because it's squeezed between two books that are from a later date. It was a little confusing in the beginning because I was trying to figure out exactly when it took place compared to book 6. And now that I'm reading book 8 it really doesn't make sense. It was almost like it was an afterthought. Still worth reading, but I recommend reading it before book 6.

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
