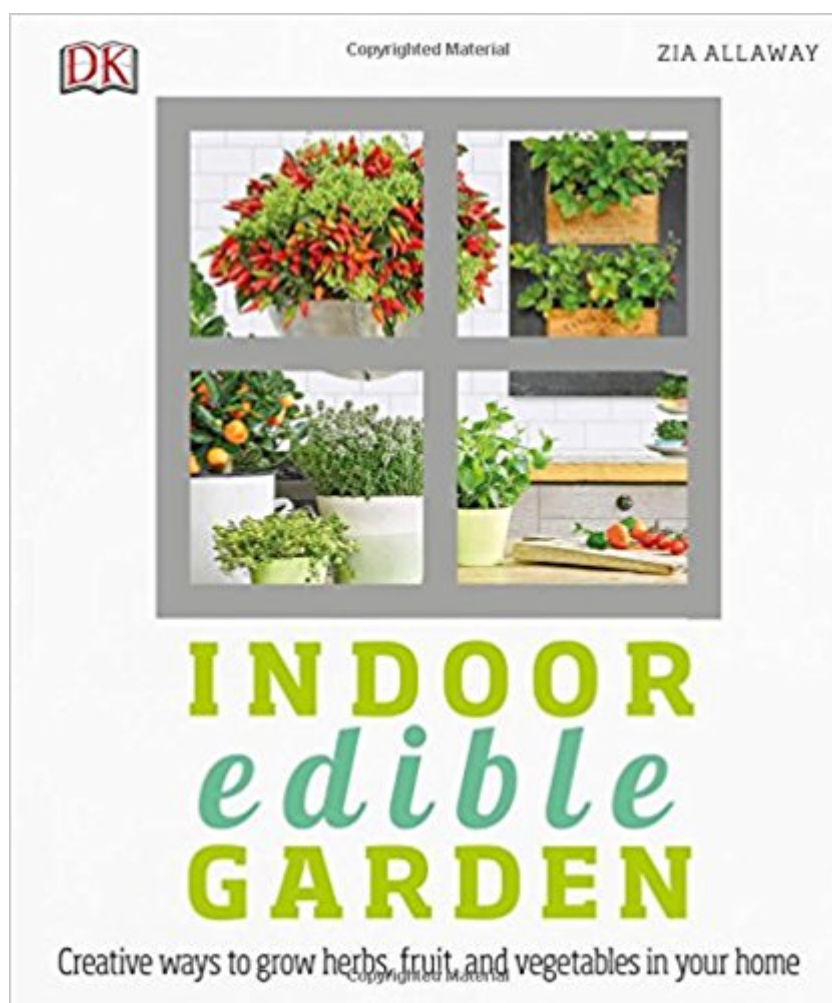

[Mediterranean Mix](#) A galvanized tub is a great choice for large fruiting vegetables, providing plenty of space for plants and handles to make it easier to move around so all your crops receive sufficient light. [Cucamelons in Hanging Crates](#)

The cucamelon's ivy-like foliage and striped baby fruits make a striking feature trailing from a wooden crate suspended beneath a skylight. [Watering & Feeding Indoor Edibles](#) All crops need the right amount of moisture to feed their roots to produce a good crop of leaves, fruits, or flowers. The trick to growing indoor crops successfully is to supply them with plenty of water while avoiding soggy soil.

[Fruit & Flower Windowbox](#) Create a mix of fruits and flowers in a windowbox for a summer-long display. Keep all the plants in the windowbox well watered, even during wet weather. [View larger](#)
