

Robyn Davidson was born in 1950 in a small country town in Queensland, Australia. She studied biology at Queensland University and music in Sydney, and later returned to Queensland to study Japanese and philosophy. Davidson then moved to Alice Springs where her trek across Australia's outback began. *Tracks* (Pantheon Books), Davidson's internationally acclaimed account of the year she spent crossing Australia's outback, won the Thomas Cook Travel Book Award and has

appeared in more than ten foreign language editions. In the years since *Tracks*, Davidson has lived in London, New York, and Australia. She returned to Alice Springs to write her first novel, *Ancestors* (Simon & Schuster).Â Rick Smolan, CEO of Against All Odds Productions is a New York Times bestselling author with more than five million copies of his books in print. A former Time, Life, and National Geographic photographer, Smolan is best known as the co-creator of the "Day in the Life" book series.Â His global photography projects, which feature the work of hundreds of the world's leading photographers and combine creative storytelling with state-of-the-art technology, are regularly featured on the covers of prestigious publications around the globe including Fortune, Time, and GEO.Â His most recent project, *The Human Face of Big Data*, captures how our planet is developing a nervous system. I love the film "Tracks"(starring Mia Wasikowska), it's breathtakingly beautiful and moving, and I love the brilliant Robyn Davidson memoir upon which it was based. There is more than one angle to a story, especially one as personal, mythic, both timeless and of-a-time, as the journey in "Tracks". This gorgeous and exquisitely detailed coffee-table book, "Inside Tracks", is obviously a labor of love that brings into sharp focus (how's that for a metaphor) a young woman's compelling trek across the outback that opened endless vistas, both outward, and, most tellingly, within herself. With both the original stunning photographs and then contemporary ones from the film and it's production, this edition of Robyn Davidson's story really helps draw together the real and the abstract journey it has taken over the last several decades - from trek, to photos, to book and now to movie. The photographer Rick Smolan (played by Adam Driver in the film) has really created a thing of beauty that will take me a while to absorb - this is a wonderful book, for the photos and also for the text and the movie's script, with accompanying stills. There's also some superb writing from Robyn herself that is strategically placed halfway in the book, between the original journey and the one taken in the film. I'm also looking forward to making use of the smartphone application, which can only heighten the parallel reality of this unique and memorable journey.

I've always been a fan of Rick Smolan and this book did not disappoint. The book is BIG. Seriously, I

wasn't expecting it to be so large. Gorgeous photos, lovely design and the ability to download an app to make the photos interactive. I highly recommend this to NatGeo lovers and lovers of great photography. The only thing I would add is to buy some cotton gloves as the matte finish on the pages make it easily to leave oily fingerprints behind.
