

Ray Looker is a disciple of Yahshua the Messiah, an apostle of the Messianic Jewish faith and has been a Professor of Theology. Ray is committed to preparing the Church for the coming of the Messiah. Ray spent 14 years in the U.S. Army as a Senior-Ranking Non-Commissioned Officer. His military assignments took him to Greenland, Germany, Norway and Vietnam. He served in seven major campaigns in Vietnam, and has spent over 30 years as a Missionary and Professor in Europe, China and the inner-cities of America. With graduate degrees in Law, Ray worked as a Law Clerk in a Public Defender's Office and with a District Court Judge while doing post-graduate work for a Doctor of Theology Degree. His post-Doctorate research in Educational and Motivational Psychology allowed him to be a Program Manager in an epidemiological study of mental illness for the Department of Health and Mental Retardation for the State. He later served as a Director of Compliance enforcing a Federal Court Order on a maximum security prison for the criminally insane, a Justice of the Peace, a Notary Public and as an Auxiliary Police Officer in the State of New York. Ray ran for the House of Delegates and as a Magistrate with the idea that government

â ^servantsâ ™ were to be held accountable to the people for their actions. In addition Ray has also served as Pastor in a Christian Church and as a Messianic Rabbi in a Messianic Jewish Congregation. He has also ministered on both radio and television and has been a Baritone Soloist in various churches when asked to do so. When the Messiah comes all men will be mandated to observe the Commandments of Yahweh: i.e. the Feasts of Yahweh, His Sabbaths, the New Moons, and the Dietary Laws of the written TORAH. Rayâ ™s work and ministry is to prepare and to teach Believers the importance of keeping Yahwehâ ™s laws and commandments in accordance with the Lord's wishes and desires for us. To raise up the â ^Tabernacle of Davidâ ™ in preparation for the coming of the Lord, the Church must rebuild and restore Christianity upon the bedrock foundation of the Apostles and Prophets, which is the written TORAH. Rayâ ™s many books on Messianic Judaism are a testimony of the dedication of his life to preparing the way for the coming of the Messiah. As he is able, he intends to make these books available on the internet for worldwide access to everyone, everywhere.

As a non-Jewish person, a Christian of strong spirituality, I have always longed to learn of the Messianic ways of Christ, the ways in which He walked the earth. It makes sense to me that if we could get "as close as we can" to being like one of His actual disciples in eating what they ate, sharing dinner together, sharing finances and traveling to spread the Word together, then it would help us to be more like Christ. What Dr. Ray Looker does in this book is just that -- he lays down the foundation of the Messianic law, explaining the origins and the practices so that we, as today's Christians, can simulate the days of Christ's and try to be like Him, when He was here. Although this may be "under the Law" and we are no longer "Bound" by the law, I still believe that we can learn another dimension of spirituality by doing what Christ did, learning what He knew, and adding this additional dimension to our own spiritual lives. As a fan of all Ray Looker's books, I was very happy to see his Messianic Prayerbook. One of the first items that I bought as a new Messianic believer was a Jewish Siddur (prayer book). There were two problems with my purchase. It did not address prayer from a believer in Yahshua's perspective, nor did I really know where to begin because it was so long. The "Messianic Prayerbook" solves

both of these issues. It is indeed Messianic, focusing on our relationship to the Son of God and it is concise in that it includes the most essential prayers, rather than every possible prayer. It is perfect for home use, especially as families are beginning to return to a first century understanding of Biblical worship. The "Messianic Prayerbook" also covers prayers for Shabbat, the festivals, and other "events." I would have given the "Messianic Prayerbook" five stars, except for the simple fact that it is not a glitzy book that many expect, nor does it have page numberings. The value of the book outweighs any shortcomings in this regard. Also, I wanted to comment on the reviewer who gave it one star. The only complaint had to do with the reviewer's belief that all Messianics follow the Jewish tradition of not mentioning the name of God and by using the name, Yeshua, for the Son of God. This tradition is indeed pervasive, but is hardly a Biblical command. There are others in the Messianic movement who believe that God's name should be proclaimed. The author also believes that Yeshua is an incorrect rendering of the name of God's Son. My response, is "So what?!" The author is entitled to what he believes and the book's value is not diminished.

I got this for study. I knew very little about The Messianic faith and so it was great reading on there prayer foundation. Ray Looker is a fine writer and it was well written so that it was easy to follow as well as read. I would recommend it to anyone interested in the Messianic Faith.
