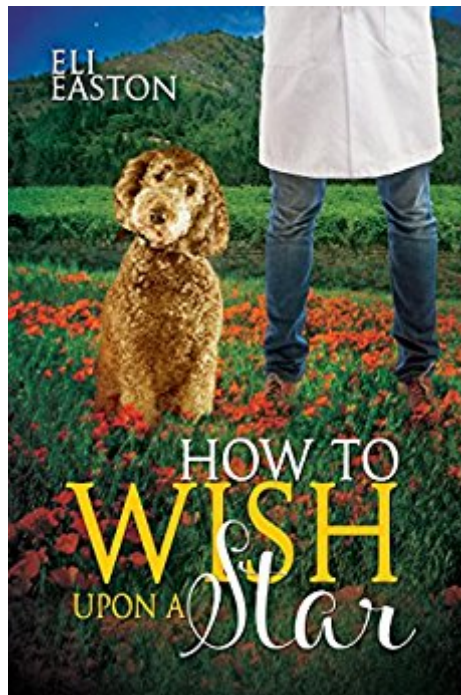




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How To Wish Upon A Star (Howl At The Moon Book 3)



Synopsis

Along the way they might discover that true love is possible—if you wish upon a star. This is the third book in the "Howl at the Moon" series, but it can be read as a stand-alone.

Jason's got a whole lot of anxiety and Milo being a comfort dog really balanced out their relationship. Once again, Easton did a fantastic job integrating the dog characteristics. Jason's highly organized and regimented but the power of Milo is he senses when the anxiety gets to be too much; it's innate.They both have stuff some of which is weighty, but Easton had them fit together so well and developed their connection on multiple levels. I really loved how their strengths helped the other making their "weaknesses" obsolete. How it mattered not that Milo doesn't have the book smarts that Jason does because he has the people smarts that Jason doesn't.This story arc is engaging and kept me riveted even though it's kind of science-y which is not my gig. I still found myself feeling a sense of urgency about the virus and finding a vaccine.Still love Mad Creek to pieces. Always. Lance and Tim and Lily. I will continue to believe Lily set the whole

first pack meeting where Jason and Milo meet up as an elaborate matchmaking ruse. Because Lily. The other dogs are super cute too and I have excite about Rav's story. The sex was sweet and hot. It had a sense of suspense to it that the other two books haven't had and I really liked that addition. In this book there is a new researcher who's moved to Mad Creek. He lived there growing up, but his mom was a wanderer so they didn't stay. He's a quickener and is doing research into how that actually happens...somewhat unsuccessfully. Jason isn't very good with people and he tends to make his interviewees cry. Milo is the opposite. He's a newly quickened human who is naturally drawn to people. He gives comfort and can sense what's wrong with others. Unlike most quickeners, Milo never had one place to call home. First he was in a shelter and then he came to live as a comfort dog in an old folks home. He always knew when the residents were about to pass. But because of that, he fairly traumatized. He never had anyone to get attached to or a place to call home, and then he had to deal with the people he cared about dying and abandoning him. It's heartbreaking. He has PTSD to a certain extent, so when he moves in with Jason and has a person and place to call home, he quickly gets attached...although he's new to this whole human thing, so he doesn't understand the nuances of relationships. The suspense aspect comes from a new virus which is invading Mad Creek. The virus strikes and the human can't help but shift to their dog form. If they can't find a cure, then they're afraid the sick dogs will revert to their animal form forever. This was my favorite in the series so far. I loved how both these guys are so incredibly socially awkward...just in totally different ways. They are both really great characters though and I loved how good they were together. They truly do bring out the best in one another. These books are always good for a light-hearted fun listen and this was another good one. I'm hoping there's more to come for the series...I'd love to see the kennel owner who was introduced in this story find his HEA (hint, hint).

I read book two and then the third in the series both did not require reading the books in order, but now I have ordered the first one and expect to love it as much. What a fun twist on the wolf shifter stories. Not a wolf in sight but instead a town of multi-generational and newly "quickened" dogs. Lovable pets that became human when their previous owner died. The town of Mad Creek welcomes them all, finding them a place to live, classes in reading and writing and how to be human. It's full of humor friendship and love. Just imagine trying to be human after living years as a dog. The new humans retain many of the traits of their breed and other traits such as sniffing each other and wagging their rear ends when happy. I sure hope there are more books in this series

I liked the other two better, but this was still very much a 5 star book! Jason really grows on you, and Milo is such a cutie. I like how the first book was like pure romance with a tiny bit of mystery, the second was crime drama (and romance), and this one is a romantic medical thriller. So neat!
