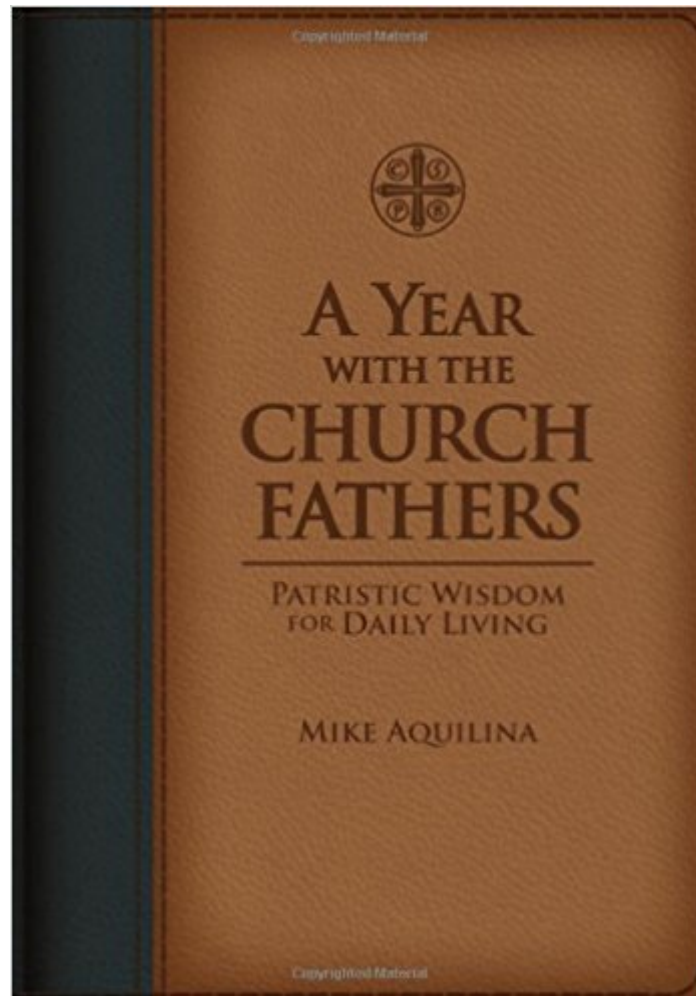

You've probably seen some advertisements for this book around the internet and in print. St. Benedict Press and Mike Aquilina have done a great job with this daily devotional. I was just telling someone yesterday that I don't have much "need" for modern yet-to-be-approved private revelations because I haven't learned all I can from approved sources. The Church Fathers are one of those and this book is a great introduction to them. Let's first of all judge it by the cover, which we are told never to do. We have here a very beautiful rendition of the highly flexible, soft, leather-feel, DuoTone/Ultrasoft material. It is comfortable to hold and the two-tone cover is a nice touch. If this were a Bible I would prefer a solid color. I don't know if this was intentional or not but the book has a near-semi-yapp cover on it. There is certainly a generous over hang. Intentional or not, it will help keep the guilt edges from getting marked up. The embossing on the cover is great as usual with S.B. Press. You can see above there is a topic for the day, a short explanation, an excerpt from a Church Father, a short meditation, and a closing prayer. This may be a good way to begin the practice of mental prayer for ordinary Catholics. Not having read the whole thing yet, I can't vouch for all of the text but Mr. Aquilina is a well known and trusted apologist. A Year with the Church Fathers - Patristic Wisdom for Daily Living, brings to us a sample of the

early writings of the Church Fathers whose faith, and truths are shared with us in simple daily reflections, which we can draw upon. For example: To my surprise, I gave a talk on Saint Moses, a monk in the Fourth century, who was a thief, robber and murderer, but who when attacking a monastery met an abbot who was meek and mild and influenced him. St Moses eventually converted to the Coptic Church, then a branch of the Catholic Church, and though it was not an easy conversion, confessed his sins, became a monk, and through his leadership, converted many to the faith. In the book, on Day Two, I found this passage, after I returned home from the retreat, under the title, "SEE GOD EVERYWHERE", "St. John Cassian remembers how the wise old abbot Moses told him to see God everywhere. If you approach with a pure heart, the world around you will show you His face." There follows a fuller explanation on this theme, and at the end, a consideration, and closing prayer to reflect upon. Just enough to wet the appetite of the spiritual soul, and find wisdom for the day. I highly recommend this book. The leather cover, and ribbon, makes it a handsome book, and a year's worth of wisdom, to enrich everyone, of all faiths, or those who seek the Truths passed down through the ages from Christ. I love this book. My favorite thing to read each day is the second reading in the Office of Readings. There is so much catechesis on Church teaching packed in those readings. Well, Mike gives us the same. Who better to teach us about the truths of the Faith than the Church Fathers? It's daily retreat into the mind and heart of the Church and into what God wants us to consider, then live. It's a dynamite combination: The Church Fathers' teachings, meditation on those teachings, then conversation with God. Another great book from Mike.

Mike Aquilina has written several books on the Fathers of the Church. *A Year With the Church Fathers--Patristic Wisdom For Daily Living*, is an artistically beautiful book, with a reading from one of the Fathers for every day of the year. These are fairly brief meditations followed by one or two focus questions and a closing prayer. Knowing of Aquilina's work I had high expectations for this book and it more than fulfilled my expectations. If you want to get a feeling for the writings of the Fathers without having to work through a book of each of the Fathers, well this is the book for you.

Then I sit again with the questions at the bottom, sometimes I can't answer them but it does give me "food for thought" during the evening. The closing prayer is helpful and seems to put my thoughts at ease and into a quietness. I enjoy this book and the fact that the Church Fathers are coming to me with the writings are like they are with me as I read. It's a good ending to my prayer time.

I highly recommend this book to anyone looking for a spiritual start to their day. It has broadened my Catholic Christian outlook immensely with little kernels of wisdom.
