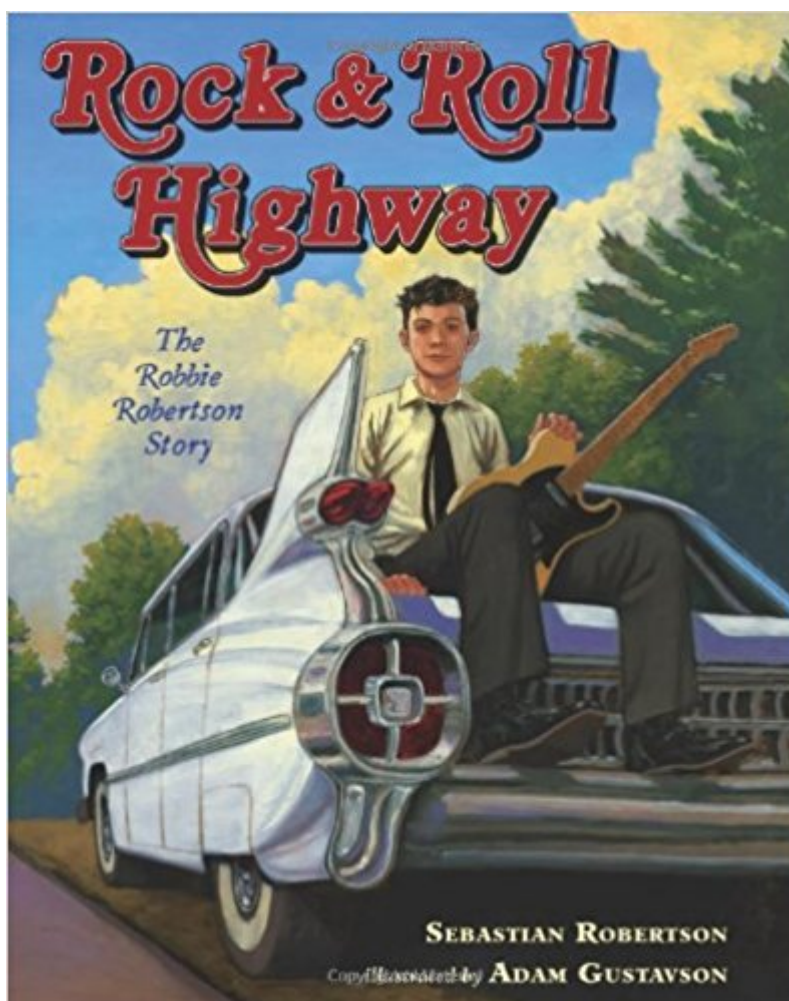

Rock And Roll Highway: The Robbie Robertson Story



Synopsis

Canadian guitarist and songwriter Robbie Robertson is known mainly for his central role in the musical group the Band. But how did he become one of Rolling Stone's top 100 guitarists of all time? Written by his son, Sebastian, this is the story of a rock-and-roll legend's journey through music, beginning when he was taught to play guitar at nine years old on a Native American reservation. Rock and Roll Highway is the story of a young person's passion, drive, and determination to follow his dream.

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Gr 1-4 "This attractive picture book biography profiles artist Robbie Robertson, founder of the Band, the group known for backing up Bob Dylan and for the songs "The Weight," "Up on Cripple Creek," and "The Night They Drove Old Dixie Down." Written by Robbie Robertson's son, Sebastian, the book takes readers through Robbie's life, starting with his birth, covering his childhood in Toronto, development as a musician, and rise to fame, and ending in the mid-1970s with the Band's final performance. The use of dialogue adds to the appeal, keeping the tone lively and accessible. The tone is enthusiastic, bordering on worshipful at times ("It was now 1961 and

people came from far and wide to hear the hottest, youngest guitar player around"). Gustavson's rich, nostalgia-tinged oil paintings will provoke plenty of smiles of recognition from adult rock fans, portraying as they do places such as the Brill Building, where Robbie met songwriters Jerry Leiber and Mike Stoller, and Big Pink, the house in Woodstock, New York, where the Band's most famous album was recorded, as well as artists with whom Robbie interacted, like Buddy Holly, Jerry Lee Lewis, and, of course, Dylan. However, these details aren't likely to resonate with the intended audience, for whom the mere mention of Music from Big Pink and "The Last Waltz" won't conjure up beloved memories. Though this is a well-illustrated and nicely told story, the subject matter will limit its appeal.â "Mahnaz Dar, School Library Journal

Kids who like dancing around to their parentsâ™ (or grandparentsâ™) LPs may get a kickâ™ and learn something, tooâ™ from this insightful picture-book bio of rocker Robbie Robertson, penned by his son. Robbieâ™s epic journey on the rock and roll highway is just that. Growing up as the child of a Mohawk Indian mother and a Jewish professional gambler, Robbie developed an interest in music that was fueled by reservation storytelling. He became a classic play-till-your-fingers-bleed fanatic, and he was soon drafted to be part of Ronnie Hawkinsâ™ outfit. A fortuitous meeting with Bob Dylan led to the formation of The Band, a folk-infused rock group that so confounded Dylanâ™s fans that Robbie had to learn to play without looking at his fingers so as to dodge the thrown refuse. Author Robertson hits all the right notes, knowing just when to bend the strings to work in bits of fascinating detail or esoterica. This book is fine for what it is...a children's book about a great rock musician and songwriter. Like

other folks, I mistakenly thought I'd be reading a detailed account of Robertson's life in and out of music, like those written by or about other popular music figures (such as recent books by John Lydon, Elvis Costello, Neil Young, David Byrne, Chrissie Hynde, etc.) only to find a book that would truly be at home on the shelf of a child (except - what child would find Robertson's story "interesting"?) Read the description before purchasing. If little Joanie or Jimmy likes the music of the Band or Dylan or Mr. Robertson, this book is for her/him. The illustrations are OK but the text is simplistically written, uh...like a children's book - an expensive children's book. You could argue that an over-simplified story about a musician such as Robertson only trivializes the work he's done, both with The Band and as a solo artist. Considering his accomplishments, Robertson's story deserves to be told in full.

Story-teller: it's in the blood, father and son. Since I am personally touched by Robbie's compositions and performances, and always seek out his interviews, I am happy to have this book in hand by Sebastian Robertson. The story includes Robbie's early inspirations, influences and motivation into a music career and his persistent work to be excellent. Loved the illustrations, the time line and personal photos, and particularly the interview at the end.

In this beautifully told and richly illustrated story, Robbie is revealed as a boy falling in love with music and storytelling, driven by a sustained fire of inspiration. This same fire is mirrored in the love and drive of the son and author, intent on telling the personal story of his father's journey. It will delight young readers and provide a valuable and compelling tale for parents to share with their own child. Dreams can be followed and achieved!
